It is recommended that your child is active for 60 minutes per day. We would normally ensure that children have opportunities to be active for at least 30 minutes a day at school and then parents are asked to ensure they get 30 minutes at home. We have built in active time during the remote learning day and ask that you encourage your child to be active in these sessions and after the school day finishes.
