

What is Tik Tok?

TikTok is a free social media app that lets you watch, create, and share videos -- often to a soundtrack of the top hits in music -- right from your phone. It was originally available as **musical.ly** in the UK

Users can watch and record videos of themselves lip-synching to popular music and sound bites. Kids can create short, shareable videos ranging from funny to serious.

What is the Age Restriction?

The age restriction is 13 years old.

Tik Tok Safety

There have been concerns regarding the content on the app and also unsuitable messages that children have received when posting videos. Because of the way that you can interact with others, if you allow your child to use it, it is important that you enable the following settings.

Using Tik Tok

When you sign up for TikTok, your account is public by default, meaning anyone can see your videos, send you direct messages, and use your location information.

Privacy Settings

Go to Settings > Privacy and Safety and look for the
